## Discipleship Notes-Fellowship, Growing Together in Christ

One of the ACEFC's Values is <u>Fellowship</u> which states 'we believe that accountability, caring and a sense of belonging are essential for each believer to grow in their relationship with Christ. It is based on Philippians 2:1-4.



Paul's letter to the church in Philippi was written while he was a prisoner in Rome. He encouraged the Philippians to experience and express joy. Here he was under arrest with the threat of execution and his letter spoke of being appreciative of them for being a part of his ministry. He emphasized the importance of church unity and that believers must be in the spiritual battle together, including the worshipping and praying together.

A group of ACEFC men are currently reading a book written by Gene Getz, "Building Up One Another." The term 'one another' is the basis for a different topic in each chapter in this book. The various topics include devoted to one another, honor one another, accept one another, serve one another, and encourage one another, to name just a few. What I've been reminded is how scripture gives us some practical steps for maturing in our own faith and in the life of the church.

The New Testament contains 59 "one anothers." Love one another, forgive one another, be servants to one another, teach one another and pray for one another are just five of these commands. Many of them are found in Paul's Letters.

As we go forward search for other "one anothers" in scripture and share them with one another.

## **Elders Report**

## Why Am I Not Telling Everyone About What Jesus Did For Me?

This is a question that has been coming into my mind quite often lately. I know the Great Commandment and it seems like I love God more every day. The more I learn about, pray to, worship, and serve him, He is pretty easy to love. Then I get to the neighbor part and if I really loved them as He commanded I would not want any of them to spend eternity without Him. So what's my problem? Is it apathy...or busyness...or laziness...or fear...or something else? I think most us can ask ourselves these questions. So, in this short little Elder note I'm going to share some things that I am going to try to do and have done to help me have more love for my fellow man and hopefully be able to share the God I love with more people. It seems that the more love that I have for God the more he helps me love my neighbor.

The first is to pray Ephesians 3:14-19. This is the prayer: I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen us with power through his Spirit in our inner being, so that Christ may dwell in our hearts through faith. And I pray that we, being rooted and established in love, may have power, to grasp how wide and how long and how high and how deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge that we may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.

Another thing I've done is assess my talents (sometimes they seem very limited). I have been good at trouble shooting and fixing things so I went on a few short term mission trips and through these trips God has giving me a heart for lost people. I don't see the projects as much as I see the people we are serving. This did not happen on my first few trips, but now it is what I look forward to the most. Plus serving alongside full time missionaries has given me a heart for them and God has shown Sue and me ways we can support and pray for them in the field. So I think all of us can look at what God has given us as skills, gifts and resources and ask how we can use these to serve the lost at home, at school, at work, in our community, and around the world.

As summer approaches there will be opportunities to serve our community and our body. Prayerfully ask God how he can use you to plant a seed that may lead someone to the greatest gift they could ever receive. The gift of eternal life through our Lord Jesus Christ.

## Some "Reflections" from Pastor Greg



## Fixin' My Focus & Followin' By Faith

Often ministry leaders discuss

what should be included among the goals and objectives for their ministry organization. Since our church is no exception, this is a common discussion for our church leadership and this has been something that

I've been involved in doing for the vast majority of my adult life. I'm introducing this article in this way because through the years, I have seen many different trends and theories that claim to be the latest and greatest, only to be displaced by the next set of ideas posed by the "experts."

One of my favorite professors regularly reminded us about a couple practical principles that will always be true in the area of setting your ambitions and aims. First, if you sense that change is needed, (or when something doesn't seem to be working properly) consult the Owner's Manual (God's Word)! Second, Whenever you're trying to determine the goals for a group of people, begin by making sure you've set some personal goals for yourself that

1 Peter 1:13-16

<sup>13</sup> Therefore, get your minds ready for action by being fully sober, and set your hope completely on the grace that will be brought to you when Jesus Christ is revealed. <sup>14</sup> Like obedient children, do not comply with the evil urges and desires that you had before you recognized Christ as your Lord and Savior, <sup>15</sup> but, like the Holy One who called you, become holy yourselves in all your conduct, <sup>16</sup> for it is written, "You should be holy, because I am holy."

relate to what you're trying to accomplish. In other words, don't get ahead of yourself by trying to lead others in an area where you've not been.

So, ... What would you say is the GOAL of following Christ? Is it a pathway to "Heaven?" —or — Is it a pathway to "holiness?" The inserted passage above from 1 Peter 1 helps answer this question.

As followers of Christ, our lives should be "saturated with expectancy and encouragement" because of God's saving grace. Notice what verse 13 says and how it exhorts us to always be "ready for action" and "fully sober" (able to think clearly and correctly because of our "trustworthy" hope in the Lord.) We could summarize this by saying "hope gives us encouragement in the midst of life's triumphs as well as life's trials when we fix our focus on what God is doing to help make us holy."

In addition to this, as the Lord's followers, our lives should be "set apart from evil desires and submissive to His example." Look carefully at verse 14—16. These verses admonish us to look cautiously at the patterns we follow—instead of continuing in the habits we develop because of our sin nature, we should imitate the Lord Jesus. We should acknowledge that "holiness is the everyday business of every follower of Christ. But we must realize it is impossible without God's personal presence in our lives and it's most clearly seen in the decisions we make that lead to the things we do every single day."

Yes, being a follower of Christ does mean that we are on a pathway to "Heaven," but in a more specific way, God has given us His grace to place us on a pathway toward "holiness!" Holiness is a way of life that affects everything we do. Holiness is a lifestyle, rather than mere conformity to a list of rules. We become holy as we allow God's indwelling Holy Spirit to transform our thoughts, control our conduct, and determine our decisions. Once this becomes a pattern for our lives, it helps to establish our philosophy of ministry both personally and collectively.

Please let me know what you think as you read this. I'd enjoy discussing this with you to see if we can help one another grow stronger in our relationship with the Lord.
