

Discipleship Notes-Growing Together in Christ

In the May and June newsletters, two values of ACEFC were highlighted, fellowship and evangelism. In this issue I will look at the subject of conflict which often enters into a relationship of those growing together in Christ.

Conflict is very broad and can occur in different types of situations with different levels of intensity. For the purposes of this article I wish to concentrate only a conflict between two believers. Remember we are striving to become more Christ like.

Ken Sande, a Christian author and founder of the Peacemakers Ministry has developed different peacemaking strategies for bringing about reconciliation. It is one of those strategies, based on the word of God I wish to share with you in this article. Keep in mind God uses conflict for us to glorify Him, serve others, and to grow more Christ like. The Four G principles with supporting scripture verses, responding to conflict are:

- 1. Glorify God (Mark 11:25; I Cor. 10:31; 1 Peter 2:12).
- 2. Get the Log out of Your Eye (Matt. 7:3-5).
- 3. Gently Restore (Matt. 18:15-20).
- 4. Go and be reconciled (Matt. 5:23-24).

Discipleship is the maturing of oneself and the helping of others to become more Christ like in each and every aspect of life. If you find yourself in a conflict consider these four g's. However, if you're needing help in working through this seek out the leadership of ACEFC or myself. We are here to help you.

"For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that Day, and not only to me but also to all who have loved his appearing. "



2 Timothy 4:6-8

The Apostle Paul wrote these words to Timothy from a Roman prison, anticipating his imminent execution. Paul was confident that in his last days he had endured to the end and finished well. I love the story of Paul and all he went through in his life as a great example of God's grace, endurance, and an anticipation of the crown of righteousness that awaited him as a faithful servant here on earth.

Two other great examples in my life of persevering and faithful Christ followers were my grandparents, Bob and Carol Dietsche. Just less than 1 year apart (my grandpa two weeks ago), both went home to be with their Savior. As I have reflected on their godly examples, legacy and impact on me, it has encouraged me to finish the race well. It was such a blessing to be able to watch both my grandparents finish their individual races well.

Just one recent example from my grandfather was in personally watching his consistent bold witness to the nurses' aides and radiation technicians in his hospice unit. He leveraged most conversations in his last weeks of life to share the good news of Jesus Christ with all he came in contact with. He had full confidence in where he would be going and wanted others to join him.



Earlier in my life, I often turned to this passage from Paul and wondered if—or when we might reach the point where this could/would actually happen. An accurate look at history shows how the Church in Europe shifted away from biblical teaching and now research shows that the culture in our country is predominantly turning toward ideas and ideals that question the authenticity and authority of the Bible. For the remainder of this article, I'd like to insert Bible verses that encourage and edify us by emphasizing the benefits of knowing God's Word. Psalm 119:11 In my heart I store up Your words
So I won't sin against You

2 Timothy 2:15 Make every effort to present yourself before God as a proven and diligent worker who does not need to be ashamed, teaching the message of truth accurately.

Proverbs 30:5—6 Every word from God is pure and tested to be true; He is like a shield for those who take refuge in Him. Don't add to His words, or He will correct you and prove you to be a liar.

Missionary of the Month-Howard and Marilynn Plucar



Currently living in Plymouth, MN Howard & Marilynn Plucar serve as ReachGlobal pastor-to-missionaries (PTM)couple; a ministry that they have had since January 1, 2010. From January 1, 2010 until October 1, 2013, Howard & Marilynn served in a part-time capacity as pastor-to-missionaries couple while at the same time serving an international church in Tokyo and also managing the ReachGlobal-Japan guest apartment. On October 1, 2013, they became full-time PTM couple serving ReachGlobal staff in 12 countries – 3 in Asia, and 9 in Western Europe – giving pastoral care to a far -flung "congregation" of about 220 adults and children.

We speak of our ministry as PTM ("Pastor-to-Missionaries") couple for ReachGlobal as a "ministry of presence" to our colleagues for their total

health, well-being, and effectiveness in life and work. We could also add the word, "encouraging" onto "ministry of presence" as we work with our staff to build them up in their life with Jesus Christ, walk with them through "deep waters" at times, promote healthy team relationships, and help them with self-knowledge and understanding as beloved children of God.

Prior to 2010, they served for 13 years as area leaders for ReachGlobal in East Asia/Pacific Asia with responsibility for ReachGlobal staff health and effectiveness, investigation and development of new work, and collaboration with national/international partners. Prior to that assignment, they served for 8 years as District Missions Consultants for ReachGlobal in the Forest Lakes District (Wisconsin and Upper Michigan). They also served as short term workers in Japan in the mid 1980s as well as serving EFCA Churches in Wisconsin, including 10 years as Pastor of Faith EFC of Manitowoc, Wisconsin from 1974-1984. Howard & Marilynn have been in EFCA Ministry for 46 years, 34 of those years with ReachGlobal. They have been married for 47 years, and have two children (Kris and Bryan) and two grandchildren (Owen & Ana).

PRAYER & PRAISE

- 1. Praise God with us for the privilege of being part of the ReachGlobal Member Care Team for the past 8 ½ years. This is a delightful group of people to work with under the caring, wise leadership of our retiring leader.
- 2. From July 1, we become the interim directors of member care for ReachGlobal. Ask the Father for wisdom to know how to walk with the team through a time of transition and preparation for the future.
- 3. Our financial support is back at the "critical" level as we have lost some financial support over the past 6 months due to circumstances beyond our control. Please pray that God will supply the \$1,700/month that we are lacking in financial support, especially as we begin our expanded responsibilities.
- 4. Please pray for two major ReachGlobal events that we are participating in during July: Pre-Field Training at the University of Northwestern in St. Paul...and following that...Debrief for workers on home assignment. We have a record number of staff participating in debrief, so we would ask you to pray for the Lord's energy and wisdom.
