November is Operation Christmas Child month but we have to get started packing our shoe boxes now!

OCC, as many of you know, is a ministry of Samaritans Purse. OCC has been collecting shoe boxes filled with gifts and distributing them to children in need around the world for 25 years. Each child receives a booklet about Jesus in their box and also has the opportunity to participate in a follow up discipleship program call "The Greatest Journey."

How to pack a shoe box:

- 1. Get a shoe box[©] You may use a standard size shoe box or there are new cardboard and plastic boxes available online. (samaritianspurse.org/OCC)
- 2. Choose whether your box is for a boy or a girl and choose their age range.
- 3. Every box needs a WOW item; examples are a doll, stuffed animal or a soccer ball w/pump.
- 4. Add other gifts; toys, hygiene items, school supplies, etc.
- 5. Pray for the child you have chosen. Include a personal letter or a picture if you like.
- 6. Include a \$9.00 donation for shipping. If you make the donation online you may "Follow Your Box" and discover its destination.
- 7. Bring your box to church ad place it under the OCC table in the foyer by November 11.
- 8. Please do not include: candy, toothpaste, gum, used items, war related items, seeds, food, liquids or lotions, medications or vitamins, breakable items, glass containers or aerosol cans.

The Energizing Effect of Encouragement: It's Something We All Need to Receive ... & Give



If a survey could accurately identify the most significant needs that most everyone has, it shouldn't be a surprise to find that **encouragement** would be close to the top of the list. It's common for many of us to hear how "everyone can use a good dose of encouragement!" Pointing out a couple thoughts to help introduce the rest of this article: it would be nice if encouragement was contagious—that it would simply spread from one person to another, but that doesn't seem to be how it works. Sadly, it's usually discouragement that becomes contagious—it often spreads like wildfire! How can we change this trend?

Consider this relevant story provided in a newspaper column several years ago about a retired schoolteacher. One day she had her students take out two sheets of paper and list the names of the other students in the room. Then she told them to think of the nicest thing they could say about each of their classmates and write it down by their names. She took the papers home that weekend and compiled a list for each student of what the others had said about him or

her. On Monday she gave each student his or her list. Before long, everyone was smiling. "Really?" one whispered. "I never knew that meant anything to anyone." "I didn't know anyone liked me that much!"

Years later, the teacher went to the funeral of one of her former students, who had been killed in Vietnam. Many who had been in that class years before were there. After the service, the young man's parents approached the teacher and said, "We want to show you something. Mark was carrying this when he was killed." The father pulled out of a wallet the list of all the good things Mark's classmates had said about him. "Thank you so much for doing that," Mark's mother said. "As you can see, Mark treasured it."

A group of Mark's classmates overheard the exchange. One smiled sheepishly and said, "I still have my list. It's in my top desk drawer at home." Another said, "I have mine, too. It's in my diary." "I put mine in our wedding album," said a third. "I bet we all saved them," said a fourth. "I carry mine with me at all times." At that point, the teacher sat down and cried. And, she used that assignment in every class for the rest of her teaching career.

Isn't it amazing how much this story reveals the

Now we who are strong have an obligation to help bear the weaknesses of those who are without strength, and not simply live to take care of ourselves. Let each of us please our neighbor for the sake of building him/her up. For even Christ didn't please Himself, but as it is written, "The insults of those who insult You have fallen on Me." For whatever was written in the past was written for our instruction, so

that through endurance and also through encouragement from the Scriptures, we might find hope. Now may the God of endurance and encouragement give you harmony with one another from (being in) Christ Jesus so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

importance of encouragement? Initially, (like often happens) I began writing about something else in this article. However, as I prayerfully finished what I wrote first, even though it addressed something relevant and valuable, I wasn't "encouraged" by what it said. In my preparations to focus attention on our need for encouragement, I found several clever sayings that could be included. But, once again, there was something hollow and not quite right. I paused for a bit to pray and almost immediately I remembered reading the story above—it says so much because it provides a real life example of how expressing appreciation for others is uplifting and in some special way, is life—changing. Please notice what Romans 15:1—6 says about encouragement and hope.

What should we take from this? Very simply stated: There is an energizing effect that can come from a simple word of appreciation! And it can become contagious when we recognize that encouragement is not merely something that from time—to—time we'd each like to receive. It's also something we should enjoy giving to others ... and then it just might become something that spreads.

Elder Report-How and When Should I Worship?

Jesus told the woman at the well that a time was coming when true worshippers would worship the Father in spirit and in truth. Genuine worship involves both fact and faith. That fact is there is one true God revealed in the Bible, through Jesus. It's more than just outward motions. It's an inner submission of yourself to God.

In Matthew, Jesus warned us about worshipping the Father in vain. Sometimes I let false gods get in the way of my true worship. Business, material things, the use of my time, my thoughts, my job, even my family and so many other things get in the way of my true worship. Sometimes I get caught up in human rules and rituals of worship that can also get in the way of true worship. During Sunday mornings I can find myself not fully praising the God of the universe because I may be preoccupied by worldly things.

What can I do to try and not fall into the traps that may cause my worship to be in vain?

One thing that I have been working on for years is to realize that everything I have is only because of God. My house, my cars, my job and all my stuff all belongs to Him. If something gets broken, lost, taken away or someone needs to use something it's all His. In the view of eternity none of that stuff matters. That helps me not idolize junk and be thankful to the One who makes everything possible. As we pray to our God and Father about you, we think of your faithful work, your loving deeds, and the enduring hope you have because of our Lord Jesus Christ. 1 Thessalonians 1:3

Another thing is to try to be in constant communication with God. When I wake up I thank Him for hot running water, indoor plumbing, my old Chevy truck to get me to work. You get the idea, just think about all the ways you are blessed every day. If I can remember to do that as much as I can throughout the day it is much easier to stay in worship mode.

Sometimes I think of one of my favorite praise songs or hymns and think about the words. Sometimes the deep theological meaning of the lyrics are so good that I cannot help but praise the God I love.

Then, just serving where you feel lead can be a great way to worship the Father. When I am serving others I believe it honors God. There is no better way to show your love for Him than to share the gospel with someone. Tell them about what God did in sending His Son and what Jesus did for you and how it will change their life forever.

If you are looking for ways to worship in spirit and in truth try some of these. If you have ways you worship Him please let me know so we can all worship the Creator and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ better.

Missionary of the Month-The Krause Family



The Krause family work with ReachGlobal in the Asia Division. From Andy Krause:

We are seeking to glorify God by multiplying transformational churches number of places across Asia. Here are some praises and praises and points for each place and for our family.

East Asia

 Praise God for the Pathway Bible Training and the Church Planting Forum that we hosted in East Asia last month. Both events went very well equipping leaders from multiple church networks. These leaders are eager to learn and apply what they have learned.

- Pray for effective ongoing follow-up by our team and local partners.
- Pray also for wisdom as we and our East Asian partners encounter government restrictions. Pray against a spirit of fear and that we would be wise in what we engage in.

The Philippines

- Praise God for effective church planting going on in the central islands. We have been walking alongside these church planters since a typhoon went through 4-5 years ago. We have seen over 20 churches planted.
- Pray for more people to come to faith in Jesus and more churches to be planted.
- Pray for a Discovery Bible Study our Manila team is starting in our focus neighborhood. We are inviting key leaders of the Catholic Church, two evangelical churches and the local government to be a part of this "pilot" home Bible study to set up a simple model for introducing Jesus to people in the neighborhood.
- Pray for a local sponsorship effort we have going on in a slum area of Manila. Ask God to supply 60 more sponsors so we can reach 200 kids in the program.

SE Asia & India

- Pray for the regional team that I help lead and coach that is focused on ministry among the M people of SE Asia.
- Pray for the many church planters that we are coming alongside.
- In October some from our team are hosting a retreat for church planters in SE Asia. Pray that God will use this retreat to bring rest and a renewed vision to church planters and their families.
- Ask God for guidance as we assist church planting efforts in India.
- Pray for wisdom and direction as I coach leaders on an Indian led church planting organization in the area of organizational leadership and financial sustainability.
- Each month I and a few other colleagues have been meeting with Indian leaders who were part of a Church Planting Catalyst training held in June. Through these coaching times we are seeking to help these leaders apply what they have learned and to grow in catalyzing church planting.

Our Family

- Continue to pray regularly for our health...ask God to heal us! Barb, Leah and Joanna's health continue to be very challenging and still not much progress from the effects of Lyme related infections and the toxin they have left in their bodies. My liver enzymes are still elevated. I am trying to schedule a liver biopsy to see if there is something else going on.
- Pray for perseverance and that our eyes would remain on Jesus.
