
The following paragraph written by Dr. John Babler, Professor of Counseling at the Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary answers the questions:

Growing God's Way Ministries...

Lil' Sprouts, this month the little ones will celebrate God's wonderful creation of Fish and Water.

Sprouts, this month we will focus on being Thankful. The verse for November is: Give thanks to the Lord for He is good. 1 Chronicles 16:34

K-5 Evergreens and Sunday School will continue in the book of Genesis.

Last week I was watching a soccer game and one of the players was showing disrespect to the opposing team and also to the referee. The player's coach yelled MANY times, telling his player to "stop it!" (but not in those exact words). It came to the point where I couldn't listen to his "threats" any longer, so I called out, "Take him out!" Looking back at it, I must admit that wasn't something that I'm proud of doing, but this whole situation caused me to think: "I wonder if this is the way he parents his children, by throwing out "threat after threat" without actually taking action."

So this brings me to the topic of **failing to follow through with discipline**. This might fall into the category of things we all realize, but where we still slip up. Following through with the consequences we tell them can be hard work. But when we fail to do this, eventually we could forfeit our authority, and over the years we'll also lose the respect of our kids. Trust me ...there were times when I gave threats with no follow through with my kids. I hope these simple tips can help you:

- Communicate with your spouse about discipline. Make sure you both are on the same page and recognize that your kids are smart enough to play their parents against each another. This is a BIG one and it becomes even bigger when they reach the teen years!
- Limit the number of rules you set. (I needed this tip 30 years ago. I was a big rule maker.) If your children can't remember the rules because there are too many, how can we expect them to follow them?
- Make rules that are age appropriate.
- Don't become like the soccer coach. :)

Children are a wonderful blessing and thankfully we are given grace. So do the best you can and always seek the Lord for wisdom. As often as possible, point them back to God's Word.

Some "Reflections" from Pastor Greg

Christmas is Quickly Approaching: Let's Prepare for the Opportunity to Tell Others The "Real Story!"



I've recently become acquainted with a book that has grabbed my attention. Here are a few excerpts that might grab yours and will also serve as an interesting intro to what I'd like to say in this article. (Please note that these excerpts might be seen as somewhat disturbing, but the remainder of what I'd like to say is intended to be encouraging and energizing because they will focus on the Good News we can present to our culture, especially as we enter the Thanksgiving and Christmas season when "Jesus is the Reason for the Season!")

"There will never be another Billy Graham because the world that made him possible is gone. ... He basically just preached the Bible. In the America of his time, that was enough. People stopped him in the street to shake his hand. We live in a different country now, but Billy Graham never changed. ... Yes, the world has changed, and we do 'live in a different country' now and another Billy Graham wouldn't have the same response as the late great Billy

Graham the evangelist had. ... The gospel message hasn't changed, but the way in which it needs to be presented in a secularized culture does need to change. The way we present the gospel does need to be reset in the world we now live in. ... Something is happening to America—in fact to the entire once Christianized Western world. Whether you get your news from television or online, the information is the same ... it is shocking to compare the worldview of today's generation with the one embraced by older generations in the West. ... Western civilization as a whole is becoming less Christian every day. ... We are seeing moral relativism spread like an infectious disease. And as moral relativism enjoys greater national acceptance, Christians and their worldview are treated with greater intolerance. ... But the Church can influence the culture through being salt and light. ... This is a critical moment in Church history." ... and God's Word provides us with a valuable history lesson that shows us what we can and should do to provide a foundational context for the glorious gospel message.

-from 2 Corinthians 5:11, 14-15, 17, 18, 20

Therefore, because we understand the fear of the Lord, we persuade people. ... For the love of Christ controls us, having concluded this, that Christ died for all; therefore all have died and He died for all so that those who live should no longer live for themselves, but for Him who died and rose again on their behalf. ... So then, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; what is old has passed away and what is new has come. ... All these things are from God who reconciled us to Himself thru Christ, and has given to us the ministry of reconciliation. ... Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ as tho God is making His plea thru us. We plead on Christ's behalf, "Be reconciled to God!"


This book is written by Ken Ham and is called: *Gospel Reset: Salvation Made Relevant*. It was released in April, 2018. Although it's message is sobering, I also believe it's a fascinating reminder of the powerful influence and impact of God's Word. God isn't watching us from heaven with any sense of disbelief or discouragement. He's not been caught off—guard by the conditions of our society! He has everything "under control" and He's told us over and over again that (1) He is absolutely trustworthy and He will never forsake those of us who are faithful followers of Christ. (2) His Word is a light shining on the path He wants is to walk. (3) His gracious message of forgiveness and freedom from the problem of sin never changes; and (4) we can be most effective in our "role" by consistently becoming better acquainted with Him by studying His Word.

In view of this, we should also understand that our culture is less aware of the foundational truths in the Bible than ever before in the history of our country. How do we respond to this? We should learn from Bible history. In Acts 2, when the Church started, the Jewish culture was resistant to the message of Christ, but they were also aware of what had just happened to Jesus. The message pointed directly to Christ's death, burial, and resurrection. But in Acts 17, when Paul was on Mars Hill, first he had to introduce these pagan Gentiles to the idea that God had created the world where they lived. Before He could tell them to Christ, he needed to introduce them to God.

What can we gain from this? Very clearly stated: We should all be as prepared as possible to start with the very foundation of the GOOD NEWS by explaining how our Holy Father God created us to worship Him. He sent Jesus to reveal Himself to us ... and to save us from the problem of sin. That's where the conversation should begin.

Voice of the Martyrs-In November we remember and pray for the persecuted church



We, as a church, give monthly support to this mission to our hurting brothers and sisters in Christ.

The Voice of the Martyrs is a nonprofit, interdenominational Christian missions organization dedicated to serving our persecuted family worldwide through practical and spiritual assistance and leading other members of the body of Christ into fellowship with them.

This mission is based on Hebrews 13:3; "Remember them that are in bonds, as bound with them; and them which suffer adversity, as being yourselves also in the body."



Voice of the Martyrs works and supports front line workers in restricted and hostile areas of the world.

A restricted area includes countries where government-sanctioned circumstances or anti-Christian laws lead to Christians being harassed, imprisoned, killed or deprived of possessions or liberties because of their witness. Also included are countries where government policy or practice prevents Christians from obtaining Bibles or other Christian literature.

A hostile area includes nations or large areas of nations where governments consistently attempt to provide protection for the Christian population but where Christians are routinely persecuted by family, friends, neighbors or political groups because of their witness.

Persecution of Christians continues in certain parts of the world, mostly in the Middle East and throughout South and Southeast Asia, and in Africa.

The persecution statistics are horrific: More than 300 people are murdered monthly throughout the world because of their Christian faith. Two hundred houses of worship are destroyed monthly. Almost 800 incidents of violence are committed monthly.

The Pew Center, an American secular research organization, estimates more than 75 percent of the world's population lives in areas of rampant religious persecution, mostly against Christians.

The State Department keeps an accounting of more than 60 countries where religious discrimination is practiced and encouraged.



VOM provided aid to believers after another round of violence in July, in Jos, Nigeria.

These believers are thankful for the support and prayers of Voice of the Martyrs and those who are a part of this ministry. Their prayer is not that God take them out of the situation but that He enable them to be faithful, to stand for Him no matter what the cost may be. They desire to be witnesses of His love and mercy to all who don't believe, even those who persecute them.

We believe in sharing the good news of our Lord Jesus Christ with honesty and humility. (Matthew 28:19-20)


Fellowship
