SOME QUESTIONS FOR PERSONAL REFLECTION & DISCUSSION:

—To begin, please read Exodus 2:11–3:22 to gain a better grasp of the passage we're studying. To go the extra mile, you can benefit from reading Acts 7:20–35 & Hebrews 11:23–27).

—Here are three personal questions to ask ourselves:

—How often do we see God at work in the everyday events that we experience?

—How often do we look back at events we experienced in the past and see how God was working to guide, guard, or prepare us for what we currently are facing or previously have faced?

—How frequently do we sense that God is speaking to us from what we read in the pages of His Word?

—Could Moses have had more influence by remaining in Pharaoh's court instead of refusing to be identified as an Egyptian?

—How would you answer someone who suggests, "I want to enjoy the pleasures of this world for a while; then I'll identify as a faithful follower of the Lord."?

—Moses' motives in trying to rescue the Hebrew slave who was being beaten could be seen as valid & appropriate. But his abrupt actions led to problems. What lessons can we learn from this event? We can't know for sure, but it's likely that Moses' insecurity in accepting God's call to confront Pharaoh was a result of what took place when he killed this taskmaster. What thoughts do you have about this? Have you ever experienced something that made you anxious or fearful to take on a task that you've been asked to do?

—Moses was confronted by God's holiness when he encountered God's presence in the burning bush. He removed his sandals from his feet. What are some actions we should take in showing reverence for God's holiness? How would this relate to the warning we're given about taking the Lord's name in vain?

—What are some ways in which God has used certain events in your life to prepare you for something you have faced or been asked to do?
