Jack Hibbs: The Church Can No Longer Dispute The Unprecedented Hostility Toward Truth



John 15:20 – "Remember the word that I said to you, 'A servant is not greater than his master.' If they persecuted Me, they will also persecute you. If they kept My word, they will keep yours also."

Christians argue about the lateness of the hour regarding the prophetic calendar, but the church can no longer dispute the unprecedented hostility toward truth.

Now is the time to stand strong and confront the cancel culture crowd flexing its muscles. Patriotic symbols are in their crosshairs. They've deemed Dr. Seuss controversial and classics inappropriate. Will it be long before your Bible is banned because they find it offensive?

Bullies love to prey on the weak. As a kid, I learned that the best way to deal with a playground bully was to let him know he didn't intimidate me. It often meant a fight, but I got left alone whenever I took the initiative and refused to back down.

Jesus' parting words directed His disciples to go into all the world, and 2,000 years later, His commission remains. He calls us to step into the public arena, knowing we're guaranteed the same hostility Jesus received. But don't let that stop you. The gospel of Jesus Christ is what this culture needs. Their claims of being "woke" are unfounded. The truth is that they are spiritually comatose and in need of awakening to the peril bearing down on them.

We are at a pivotal point. I urge you to champion the Word of God. Put away the distractions competing for your time and attention. Strengthen yourself in the Bible like never before.

It is time to live fearlessly. Walk and do and speak like you're confident that you're going to Heaven—because you are!

A Woman's Heart





"When my anxious thoughts multiply within me, Your consolations delight my soul." Psalm 94:19

Have you ever felt like this? I sure have! Just wanting to hide from life.

There are times when things just seem to be too much. The world appears to be spinning out of control and people are contentious and combative. Violence is rising, driven by hatred. No one listens and insults are flung around in careless abandon. Wrong appears to be rewarded and good stifled. It makes me want to sit in a corner with a box over my head!

As tempting as this image may be to me, I know it's not why I'm here. My heavenly Father, Who sees time but operates without its limits, has assigned this part of His timeline to me. Over and over in the Bible we are told to live today, don't worry about the future but live in the day we have been given.

How? When things seem so jumbled and ugly. The writer of Psalm 94 wondered the same thing. He asked, "Rise up, O judge of the earth; repay to the proud what they deserve! O Lord, how long shall the wicked, how long shall the wicked exult?" (vv. 2-3) Isn't that what we wonder too? How long are things going to go on like this, it's not supposed to be this way, where are You?

Then, in the following verses, the psalmist remembers Who God is and what He has done. He recalls "When I thought, "My foot slips," your steadfast love, O Lord, held me up." (v. 18) This memory is followed by, "When my anxious thoughts multiply within me, Your consolations delight my soul." (19)

Maybe you are feeling like putting a box over your head. With anxious thoughts multiplying and fears ballooning we sometimes just want to shut it all out. That's not a bad idea. In fact, when we shut everything out our next choice should be to focus in on God alone. We are told in today's verse it is possible to find so much consolation from the Lord that we can experience delight, not defeat or dread. Remembering Who God is the first step.

He is our shield, our hiding place, our champion. He is good, He is love, He is our protector. He is the Creator, He is in control, the King of the Universe. He sees us, knows us, hears us and is aware of every single thing that concerns us. He cares so much that He knows how many hairs are on our head.

We can also remember all God has done. The Bible is filled with facts about the ways God took care of His people, amazing victories against staggering odds. There are answers to prayer for needs and desires. There are instances of miraculous provision and deliverance. Above all there is God's salvation plan through Jesus that was finished when He rose from the dead.

There are probably things you can see that God has done in your own life. Remembering these things can bring us consolation when we are tempted to throw in the towel on life. We can look to the future with hope when we remember that God has made promises about what will be coming. Our great hope is the return of Jesus to bring things into order and there will be peace at last.

So, maybe go ahead and put that box over your head and get quiet with God as your focus. He promises to delight your soul. Then, get up, take that box off and live your day in the strength, hope and light of God.

Maintaining Our Focus: In The Midst Of Constant Distractions, God Provides Us With Principles & Priorities That Protect Us From Becoming Overwhelmed!



"We're living in an extremely fast–paced society where one of our greatest challenges might very well be *information overload*." There are many times when I've either heard others say this or I've personally repeated it myself. While I readily acknowledge that there are plenty of other personal issues and concerns that often grab our attention, I think it's wise for us to realize that paying close attention to the 24/7 news cycle can become distracting, disturbing, discouraging, or disheartening.

But that doesn't mean it's something we should avoid! *Instead, we should learn how to respond or react in a proper manner with the guidance of the Lord and His Word!*

One of the first things I'd like to point out is that God's Word encourages faithful followers of Christ to be reasonably well—informed about the major events happening in our world. This motivates us to pray in a more specific manner for our families, our government leaders, our church, our pastors & church leaders, missionaries, and others who might be important to us. Please consider what Ephesians 6:18 teaches, "With all prayer and petition, pray at all times in the Spirit, and with this in view, be on the alert with all perseverance and petition for all the saints." It shouldn't need to be repeatedly emphasized, but prayer should always be a top priority. Too often it seems as if the fast—paced routine that tends to control our schedules can squeeze our time for prayer out of our daily agenda. Usually this isn't intentional or planned, but it can develop into a habit caused by failing to establish the priority of praying at regular intervals thru—out the day. Being too busy to pray probably means we're too busy!!!! Colossians 4 reminds us to devote ourselves to prayer and 1 Thessalonians 5 instructs us to pray without ceasing!

Since it does seem that God desires us to be informed enough to guide us in our prayers, it's also a benefit to understand what Scripture teaches us about worry, anxiety, and fear. Philippians 4:6–7 is a well–known passage that many people find helpful, encouraging, and straight to the point. It also exhorts us to pray and warns us about becoming so distracted by life's challenges that we can't think straight. It says, "Don't become controlled by anxiety, but always through prayer and petition with gratitude let your requests be made known to God. Then the peace of God, which is beyond our understanding, will protect your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."

Finally, we can gain some additional guidance from Hebrews 12:1–3. "Therefore, since we have so many biblical examples of people who had faith in the Lord, let us also lay aside every hindrance and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that lies before us, focusing our eyes on Jesus, the source and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. For consider Him who has endured such hostility by sinners against Himself, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart." What is this powerful passage trying to tell us? Here are three things for us to consider. {1} Even though there are many examples of faithful people in the Bible, we all should desire to be more like Jesus! {2} When we find ourselves distracted or overwhelmed by the circumstances of life, let's remember that the race we're running is a marathon, not a 50–yard dash! {3}, Keeping our focus on what Jesus accomplished for us in His sacrifice and victory over death will provide us with the spiritual energy and encouragement we need to endure and remain strong!
