The Year of 2025 in Review.

For those of you who were there, the Annual Church Business meeting of last January was the start of a more family friendly, Christ-like atmosphere for church business meetings than in the years past. We were blessed to have so many different pastors and missionaries and elders share our pulpit. Each one brought their own distinctive approach to the scriptures and what God was saying through them.



"They ran throughout that whole region and carried the sick on mats to wherever they heard He was. And wherever He went—into villages, towns or countryside—they placed the sick in the marketplaces. They begged Him to let them touch even the edge of His cloak, and all who touched it were healed."

Mark 6:55-56

This was really the height of Jesus ministry. He had shown His authority over creation, the spiritual powers of evil and over the suffering of illness and physical limitations in this fallen world.

The first time we hear of healing happening by touching the edge of His cloak was the woman who was healed after twelve years of slow

hemorrhaging. Now this was multiplied by many more being healed just by touching the edge of His garment.

Try to imagine the scene of this desperate longing. Sick people on mats everywhere you looked. Their loved ones straining to make sure they were close enough to Jesus to touch Him. Imagine the hurried journeys and search for a place close enough to reach Him so healing could happen.

What they wanted more than anything else from Jesus was physical healing. They were willing to do whatever it took to attain it. If they reached Him healing was guaranteed. How well I understand their longing. I know I would have done whatever it took if I was sure getting my loved one there would heal them.

The question that came to my mind was, what do I want most from Jesus?

Yes, what He does for us is wonderful. Above all Jesus died for us to cancel our sin debt and make freedom from sin and union with God possible. He has provided for me over and over with provision, protection, healing, and comfort.

Still I ask, what do I want most from Jesus, now that I belong? Is it everything He makes possible for me; all He does or is it Himself?

There's a wonderful hymn called the Deep, Deep Love of Jesus. It expresses so well how His amazing love envelopes us. It's this love, this presence that I want to bathe in and be part of. How could there be anything more beautiful and fulfilling than to have Jesus, God Himself, as my daily partner.

O the deep, deep love of Jesus, vast, unmeasured, boundless, free!

Rolling as a mighty ocean in its fullness over me!

Underneath me, all around me, is the current of Thy love

Leading onward, leading homeward to Thy glorious rest above!

Some Prayerful Thoughts from Pastor Jim



If you've joined our New Testament Bible reading program by now you've "watched" Jesus get baptized by John the Baptist (and it was by immersion!), Jesus refutes the devil with Scripture, may have realized the devil's solicitation happened to him having just come off a 40 day fast, talk about an opportunists! The devil will always look to tempt us when we're hungry, angry, lonely or tired aka H.A.L.T.

You've read the most famous sermon ever known to man in the sermon on the mount, pausing to take a breath to appreciate and internalize His message. What were some of your most challenging moments in the sermon on the mount? I was struck by the on going juxtapositions between murder and murder in the heart, adultery and adultery in the heart, loving my friends but not my enemies giving publicly versus privately, longer prayers in private and shorter prayers in public, fasting privately or letting the world know how devout you are.

The comparisons continue when Jesus challenges us regarding where we're storing our treasures, thinking we can serve two different masters, then telling us our worry is the result of simply failing to understand how birds live and lilies grow. Why not jump on board and join us in this Bible reading adventure through the New Testament?

Here's a challenge for all of us; In reading Matthew 7 would you look for the beam in your own eye rather than the speck in your brothers?

Please let the office know if you need a Bible reading schedule and feel free to let me know when you're knocked over by an "aha moment" while reading "His" word!



I recently discovered the book; "Jesus Skeptic" written by an award winning writer and millennial John Dickerson. As a self proclaimed skeptic with a marginal Christian background he set out to research the impact Christianity has had upon the world. Employing investigative methods and researching only primary source materials he came to a stunning conclusion; **Jesus inspired his followers into the greatest social movement of all time!**

Dickerson details the history behind Christians who founded every one of our top 10 colleges, almost every leading hospital, and yes addressed and ended slavery

Next time you hear someone blame shifting Christianity as a contributor to our countries decline you will be equipped to share an historical apologetic and give a defense to the undeniable history behind our countries foundations and concrete inscriptions.

The book made for a meaningful Christmas gift to my daughter which I know will be an eye opener as she contends with conversations around equity that consume many of her Millennial and Gen Z peers.

Every generation has had its apologists who capture the attention of Christians who in turn are emboldened to share the gospel to the skeptics among us. My generation consumed Josh McDowell's series of books "Evidence Demands a Verdict." Many have found Lee Strobel's series on the "Case for Christ" compelling and helpful in bolstering faith and emboldening gospel witness. John Lennox the Irish mathematician, bioethicist and lay theologian provides brilliant logic in defense of the existence of God not to mention more secular thinkers like Jordan Peterson's quest for truth.

It's evident the book "Jesus Skeptic" is one of the premier apologetical works that's inspiring Millennials, Gen Z and Alpha giving them courage and conviction to believe, defend and declare the gospel.

I trust many of you will dive into this read and engage our culture with the good news of the Gospel of Jesus and the undeniable impact Christianity has had on forming the best and most altruistic parts of our society.
